The Free Software Pact is a simple document with which candidates can inform the voting public that they favor the development and use of Free Software, and will protect it from possible threatening legislation.

In 2009, 216 candidates to the European Parliament in 10 countries signed the Free Software Pact. In 2014, in the context of mass surveillance and lock-in into proprietary solution, Free Software is more relevant than ever.

The May 2014 European election is our chance to raise awareness among our future MEPs. Let's make them all commit to the protection of Free Software by signing the Free Software Pact!
